CSM's History

The Canadian School of Milan was founded in 2004 by Antonella Salvadori del Prato, an Italian-Canadian educator who set out to create the kind of school she wished existed for her young son, one that reflected the values of her own childhood in Canada: emotional awareness, social connection, creativity and a deep respect for others and the natural environment.

Drawing on her background in music and sociology, she started a small nursery in Via Plinio, Milan, with a large private garden and a focus on the early years as a stage of life where learning, identity, and values begin to take shape. Her vision quickly resonated with other families, and the school community began to flourish.

In 2014, CSM moved to the Gioia Campus, expanding to include Primary and Middle School, and High School programmes. In 2023, the new Vivaio campus was inaugurated to welcome Senior School students and offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme.

Now, more than 20 years since its founding, and unlike schools managed by large groups or equity funds, CSM continues to be personally overseen by its founder. Antonella Salvadori del Prato remains closely involved in the daily life of the school and in all major decisions. Her presence ensures that CSM stays true to its founding vision: a warm, student-centred education guided by values, where every child is known, supported, and inspired to thrive.

Middle & Senior School

Grade 6 to Grade 8

Middle School at the Canadian School of Milan is where students learn to meet challenges with confidence and kindness. These are years of growing independence, when curiosity deepens and learning becomes more personal. Through the Cambridge Lower Secondary curriculum, students build strong academic foundations while developing the resilience to think critically, take risks, and learn from mistakes. Supported by teachers who know them well and encourage them to go further, students begin to take ownership of their learning and discover the satisfaction that comes from effort and understanding.

Cambridge IGCSE

In 2025, the Canadian School of Milan proudly became an official Cambridge International School, offering the prestigious Cambridge IGCSE. The IGCSE is mandatory for all CSM students, providing a solid academic foundation across sciences, mathematics, languages, humanities, and the arts. This two-year programme develops independence, analytical thinking, and global perspectives, ensuring every student is well-prepared to enter their final two years of study. Our broad and ambitious subject offering includes both core and elective courses. Among these, the Double Award for Science stands out, as a programme offered by only a few schools in Italy, underscoring our commitment to academic excellence and innovation.

Grades 11 and 12

After completing the IGCSE, students at CSM choose between two internationally recognised qualifications, each leading to outstanding global opportunities:

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)

- Combines breadth and depth of knowledge across six subjects.
- Includes the core elements: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Extended Essay (EE), and Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS).
- Highly regarded by top universities worldwide, including Oxford, Cambridge, Ivy League schools, Russell Group, and leading European institutions.
- Best for students who perform strongly in final exams and inquirybased learning, and who seek a rigorous academic challenge.

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

Delivered in a hybrid system in partnership with Holy Trinity School (Ontario, Canada).

- Based on continuous assessment rather than high-stakes final exams.
- Supports students who perform best through ongoing evaluation, projects, and coursework.
- Recognised by universities in Canada, the UK, the US (including lvy League), and Europe.
- Admission depends on the student's grades, profile, and achievements just as with the IB Diploma.
- Ideal for students who excel through steady progress and consistent achievement rather than exam pressure.

Student Well-being

Our student well-being program offers comprehensive support, encouraging students to feel safe and take the risks beyond their comfort zones. With the support of parents, all staff members play crucial roles in mentoring, guiding, and supporting students daily. Additionally, one-to-one counseling and motivational group workshops are available to all students.

Excellent grades are no longer enough. CSM empowers students to leave school with the tools and self-knowledge needed to seize every opportunity that comes their way.

Co-Curricular

Drama

Our drama department is a vibrant and integral part of our co-curricular provision. We are known for our annual drama or musical production performed in a major theatre, which involves both middle and senior school students.

Music

Students regularly perform at concerts, recitals, and school events. One of the highlights of the school year is our annual School Musical production, which brings together students to stage a professional quality performance. Students also participate in school plays and drama competitions, honing their acting, production, and scriptwriting skills.

Sport

Physical activity is an integral part of student life, supporting our mission to provide a well-rounded education. Students benefit from access to outstanding local sports centres, where they engage in a variety of sports, including football, basketball, volleyball, rugby, badminton, canoeing and fencing. Additionally, we offer a Gifted Athletes Programme (GAP) dedicated to nurturing talented athletes, helping them excel both on and off the field.

Competitions

We also offer a wide range of academic competitions across subjects such as mathematics, science, and languages. Students meet regularly throughout the year to prepare, collaborate, and challenge themselves, developing confidence, teamwork, and problem-solving skills along the way.

Model United Nations

The school actively participates in Model United Nations (MUN) Conferences, attending one each year, usually in Rome or New York. These conferences simulate authentic UN assemblies, allowing students to explore global issues, understand international cooperation, and connect with peers worldwide. MUN helps develop leadership, public speaking, and negotiation skills. Preparation includes focused club sessions for researching assigned countries and topics.

Societies

Every year, students also found and lead their own societies, based on their interests and passions. These student-led initiatives range from debate, sustainability, and coding clubs to music ensembles, art collectives, and cultural groups. Through these societies, students develop leadership, collaboration, and organizational skills, while contributing to a vibrant and inclusive school community.

Clubs

Our extensive range of over 50 clubs offers something for every student, enabling them to explore their passions and develop new skills. From Art, Chess, and Computer Science to Creative Writing, Drama, Film, Model United Nations, Chinese, and Photography, there is a club for every interest, with opportunities to engage during lunchtime or after school.

Duke of Edinburgh International Award

The school is officially accredited to offer DoE. This prestigious programme empowers students to build essential life skills such as leadership, creativity, and teamwork. Recent expeditions have taken our students on memorable hikes through the beautiful landscapes of Lombardy, Trentino, and Liguria, giving them the chance to challenge themselves and connect with nature while developing valuable practical and social abilitiy.

University and Career Counselling

The aim of University and Career Counselling at CSM is to provide a comprehensive preparation and knowledge base for students and families, enabling them to make informed decisions about post-secondary education.

Our career programme beings in Grade 8 and continues up to Grade 12. Students have access to Unifrog, an online platform for exploring subjects of study, potential careers, and worldwide university destinations.

Admissions Process

1. Book tour

We offer campus tours and Open Days where you can ask questions, learn about our curriculum, and see learning in action.

2. Complete the online application

Please note you will need to upload the following documents: past 2 years of school reports, copy of passport or ID, any document disclosing your child's Special Educational Needs diagnosis (if applicable), any relevant document regarding guardianship or custody when a parent has full custody following a separation or divorce. Reference Form required for senior school applicants.

3. Assessment stage

Our Admissions Team will contact you to schedule a student interview and any necessary assessments. In some cases, entry assessments may be requested prior to the interview, depending on the student's previous schooling and report cards. Please note: all applicants for grades 9-12 are required to complete an entry assessment, regardless of educational background.

4. Offer of place

Within 5 working days of the interview or entry assessment, our Admissions Team will communicate our decision regarding the offer of a place. Families are asked to confirm their decision within 10 days of the Offer of Place by paying the Admission Fee. If this payment is not received, the place will be offered to the next applicant on our waiting list.

Quality teaching and learning are at the heart of everything we do. Our educational approach is progressive, with small class sizes that allow for personalized attention to each student.
