How do I book instrumental lessons?

To book instrumental music lessons, please fill out the form which is available on the Canadian school Website.

What is the cancellation procedure in case of illness or school trip?

In an emergency in case of illness please call the instrumental teacher before 8am on the day of the lesson, however if it is a pre-planned absence such as a school trip notice needs to be given 24 hours in advance via email or call to the music teacher. if notice is not given and the child is absent the full cost of the lesson will apply.

How do I hire instruments?

We recommend that students buy their own instrument so that they are able to practice and reach their full musical potential. However if buying an instrument is not possible we have good connections with these music stores in Milan which have instruments available for short time hire.

Are there any concerts?

Yes, we hold concerts for instrumental students who wish to perform in January and May, exact dates will be communicated via newsletter and through the instrumental teacher. Performance is a fantastic way to promote music and support the pupils musical journey.

What about exams?

Yes, students if they wish can be entered into grade exams we are currently working with both ABRSM and TRINITY. Both are prolific exam boards in the UK and completing an exam from both grants university points for the pupil for application in the future. However these exam boards are suited for different musical learners, if the pupils has a more practical learning style Trinity will be best, however if the pupil shows a more theoretical approach Trinity will be best. Grade exams can either be taken face to face or as a digital exam.

FAQ

Are there any music extracurricular clubs my child can join?

Currently the school offers lunchtime choirs , Grades 3 to 5 Tuesday, Grades 6 - 8 Wednesday and Grades 9 to 12 Friday. Musical theatre is also offered culminating in the annual school musical.

If my child's instrument is broken how do I fix it?

If its a simple problem such as broken string we recommend that the parent ask the teacher for advice - in this case it would be to buy a new string and the teacher will be able to put it on . if its a more serious matter such as a crack in the wood or broken keys , we recommend contact the teacher for advice or take the instrument to some of the renowned luthiers (instrument fixers) in Milan.

How do I help with Practice?

its a well known phrase practice makes perfect and sadly it is true . however the time, patience and concentration is often hard to obtain. We ask students to try and practice at least 4 times a week for 30 to 40 minutes to improve. We also ask for the support of parents to help achieve this . this is why we have put together a practice book to monitor students progress , once a student has practised they tick a box and the parent signs to acknowledge practice . this book needs to be taken to all lessons as it is also a communication tool between the teacher parent and student. A practice book is given to the student at the start of thier lessons.

What if the instrument my child wants to play is not currently offered?

Currently the instruments offered are violin, singing, piano, drums and guitar. However if your child wishes to learn another instrument, such as the flute, cello or saxophone, a teacher can be found, please contact the director of music, Ms Knuckey, for the next steps.
